was a year filled with tremendous progress and opportunity for the Ohio Optometric Foundation!



It was a year of change! We were honored and humbled to be entrusted with a \$2.5 million grant from the Ohio General Assembly to run the Ohio Children's Vision Initiative (OCVI), with the goal of providing eye exams and glasses to 4,000 K-12 students who lack access to necessary vision care. We are well on our way! Because of the commitment from incredible optometrists across the state, we doubled the number of students who received comprehensive eye care at an iSee clinic to over 700.

In April, Governor DeWine announced the formation of the Children's Vision Strike Force to explore ways to expand access to pediatric vision care in the coming years. Dr. Foster represented OOF on this committee, alongside OOA CEO & Executive Director Dr. Elizabeth Muckley and Interim Dean of the The Ohio State University College of Optometry Dr. Jeff Walline, among other subject matter experts. The work of the Strike Force will lead to recommendations to the Governor for increasing the number of students who receive comprehensive eye exams.

These recommendations will undoubtedly lead to more changes in 2025 and that is an exciting place to be! Speaking of change...the Ohio Optometric Foundation is about to go through a transformation of its own. Stay tuned for more exciting updates as the year progresses!

We are humbled to work with an amazing board of directors and incredible staff. Together, we are making a lasting difference, ensuring that every child has the opportunity to succeed through improved access to quality eye care. Because every child deserves to see!






